**Tucson, AZ** — Native Arizonan Dr. Ross Rich brought his insights and experiences in regenerative medicine into the classroom when meeting with RTIP students enrolled in Form & Function of the Equine Athlete.

Students were exposed to case studies involving the most state-of-the-art veterinary equipment and procedures, including the use of a rotating MRI stem cell therapy. With eight years' experience in adipose-derived stem cells, Dr. Rich touted the benefits of the therapy for treating tendon, ligaments, cartilage, and bone injuries in the equine athlete.
